

about us

The city of Cullman is one of 11 municipalities in Cullman County, and the county seat. We are a "city" rather than a "town" because our population is over 2,000. Cullman was founded in 1873 and incorporated in 1875.

our officials

FORM OF GOVERNMENT

Mayor-Council: Mayor and five City Council members are elected at-large to serve concurrent four-year terms.

MAYOR

As head of the city's executive branch, the Mayor serves as a full-time executive officer for the city, overseeing operations, departments, and personnel. The Mayor also ensures that bills are paid, executes municipal contracts, and performs functions similar to a C.E.O. of a private corporation. Because Cullman's population is over 12,000, the Mayor is not a member of the City Council.

CITY COUNCIL

As the city's legislative branch, the City Council has authority over city finances & property. They adopt annual budgets, establish policies, pass ordinances, determine services offered, & exercise authority over all legislative aspects of city government. They conduct city business at public meetings held twice monthly at City Hall.

BOARDS & COMMITTEES

There are five City Council committees that discuss and make recommendations regarding operating policies of city departments: General Government, Public Works, Public Safety, Tourism, and Utilities committees. There are also boards to perform various functions or to advise the City Council. Board members are appointed by the City Council and/or the Mayor for set-length terms.

CITY CLERK

Appointed by the City Council, the City Clerk serves as an administrative liaison between the Council and Mayor, and as a public point of contact. Duties include recordings minutes of official meetings, certifying legislative documents, authenticating and recording official acts, and maintaining records and documents.

CITY TREASURER

Appointed by the City Council, the City Treasurer is the custodian of municipal funds. Duties include keeping accurate records of funds, advising the Mayor and City Council on investments, supervising expenditures & receipts, and working with auditors to ensure that the City adheres to all applicable laws and regulations.

city glossary

ORDINANCE

law; legislation enacted by a municipality

PROCLAMATION

public announcement; declaration

RESOLUTION

formal expression of opinion or intent by a legislative body upon a vote

BUDGET

financial plan for a set period of time: The city of Cullman prepares budgets for one fiscal year (September-October).

REVENUE

income; money received: The city of Cullman receives revenue through taxes, permit & license fees, assessments, etc.

EXPENSES

expenditures; money spent: The city of Cullman spends to provide services, maintain facilities and infrastructure, etc.

CAPITAL PROJECTS

projects to help maintain or improve a city asset or infrastructure
